Steel Pans
The Steel pan is a perfect instrument, as the basic skills are easy to learn and playing the instrument does not require any previous experience. You will have accomplished a simple melody by the end of this fun and creative session.

Latin American Percussion
Learn basic techniques on a variety of hand-held percussion instruments, hand drums or stick drums. Learn how to apply the patterns to any musical style or setting. The workshop participants will put together a fun percussion ensemble piece. No previous drumming experience needed.

West African Drumming, Dance and Singing
Our resident Senegalese expert on West African music will introduce you to traditional songs, rhythms and dance.

Band in a day (Woodwind/Brass)
Choose either a brass or woodwind instrument and learn some simple techniques enabling you to experience playing in a group. All instruments will be provided, so you don't need to bring anything with you.

Garage Band - creating loops and beats
This session includes an introduction to the program, its layout and basic features such as looping and sequencing and musical elements such as timbre, rhythm, tempo, song structure and instruments.

Ukulele
Playing Ukulele is easy! By learning a few basic chords you could be strumming in no time and learn the accompaniment to dozens of traditional, children's or pop songs. No previous experience necessary.

DJ'ing
This is a fun, practical 'hands on' session where you will learn from a professional DJ, who will teach you the basic skills on our Pioneer DJ equipment

Band in a Day (Picks and Sticks)
Explore the many aspects of rock and pop music through playing in a live band and putting together a song in a day.
