Spring in Year 2



We will be writing:

A real life recount, a formal letter and a character description.

We will be developing these SPaG skills:

- Writing in first person
- Using the past tense
- Using conjunctions to join ideas
- Using expanded noun phrases
- Using powerful adjectives and interesting verbs

We will also continue with year 2 Spelling Rules.

Reading is a priority in year 2. Each child will read to an adult on a 1:1. This will also include an opportunity to guiz on their Accelerated reading book.

In year 2 we plan and carry out whole class guided reading sessions to promote reading fluency and comprehension skills.

As part of reading for pleasure, we have a class story we listen to at the end of each day. It is important children gain a love for literature.



Multiplication and Division

- using their understanding of equal groups to find the total using repeated addition
- make the connection between repeated addition and multiplication
- using multiplication symbols in calculations and the language of "lots of" and "groups of"
- Using arrays to help children understand that multiplication is commutative
- Measurement: length and height
- Measure in centimetres and metres Compare and order lengths and heights Mass, capacity and temperature
- Measure in grams and kilograms
- Measure in millilitres and litres



Our project is: Animals including humans

Pupils will be taught to:

notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults

find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air)

describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene



DT project: Wheels and Axles

Design, make and evaluate a vehicle using axles

To explore the design of vehicles, with a focus on fire engines.

To explore and use mechanisms such as wheels and axles to make a functional product

To evaluate their finished products.



We will be learning about Sikhism.

Our Big Question is: Does joining the Khalsa make a person a better Sikh?

This half term we are focusing on Look Run Avoid (part 2)

This unit aims to focus on children's movement skills and introduces concepts of attacking and defending through invasion games. They will identify ways to change direction and speed in order to avoid opponents. Children will focus on developing their spatial awareness and tactics to identify and exploit space, investigating where to move when. Children will look to apply these skills across a number of individual and team games linking in other skills.

Our Big Question is: Children compare living in Nairobi to living in London

> Children will learn about the equator and what the climate is like in Kenya

Our project is: London verses Nairobi

Children learn about the similarities and differences between the two places, including their human/physical features.
