As Stanley continues to dig holes and meet the other boys at the camp, the narrator intertwines three separate stories to reveal why Stanley's family has a curse and what the Warden is looking for. ### Bowl


I can throw or bowl accurately at a target I can change the power of my bowling dependant on the target. I can recognise a fair ball and no ball.
