




We will be writing:

We will be developing these SPaG skills:

- Relative clauses
- Fronted adverbials
- Passive voice
- Parenthesis





We will be learning about/to:

Christmas Carols for our concert.



We will be learning to:

Identify prime, square, cube numbers.

Multiply and divide by 10. 100, 1000

Identify multiples of 10, 100, 1000

Recognise, compare and order fractions.

Convert mixed numbers to improper fractions

We will be following the CPA approach (Concrete Pictorial Abstract). Children will be encouraged to follow the "Build it, Draw it, Write it, Say it" model when working with numbers.



Our Big Question is:

When did the Early Islamic civilisation begin and how enormous did it become?

We will be learning to:

Know and sequence key events of time studied, find out about beliefs, behaviour and characteristics of people, examine causes and results of great events and the impact on people.

We are working like historians by developing and using these skills: Chronological understanding, Historical Enquiry and Interpretation of History.

Christianity

To work on memory, remembering and recalling new language, improve oral work by learning to ask more questions in French and creating more personalised responses.




This half term we are focusing on the following skills:
