


### English


#### We will be writing:

We will be writing a setting description of a rainforest, based on the book 'The Great Kapok Tree'.

### French

The children will continue focusing on key vocabulary relating to 'family'

### Maths

We will also be focusing on:

- Fractions
- Decimals

Children will also continue to develop their understanding of the formal written methods of the four operations.

### Geography

Our Big Question is:

*Why is it important to protect the rainforest and how can this be done?  
What is daily life like in different parts of Brazil?*

Children will look at the location of Brazil and find out about the climate, push and pull factors of migration, the indigenous people, and urban and rural features.

### Science

Our science topic this half term is the Living things and their habitats.

Our Big Question is:

*What is the same and what is different?*

We will be exploring and using classification keys to help group living things in a variety of ways. We will also look at how the changes in environment can effect living things.

### Art

In Art and design, the children will be designing and creating a moving rainforest animal using levers and pneumatics.

### RE

We will be learning about: Judaism

Our Big Question is:

*How special is the relationship Jews have with God?*

### PE

This half term we are focusing on the following skills:

*Agility, balance, Coordination*

In this unit, children are given an opportunity to develop key fundamental movement skills.
